• Delaware River Clean Up – September 19, 2020

Member Klink reported that the Clean Up was a success following careful procedures for Covid-19. She noted that statistical data is still being compiled.

Member Klink reported that she is working on a procedure that will follow Covid-19 restrictions.

# Recycling - K. Klink

• Household Clean Up Day – October 17, 2020 – 34 permits

Secretary Klink reported that this clean-up day went smoothly, including a new separation of wood out of the waste. She noted that for 2021, the schedule will return to three dates, running from 7:30 am to 10:30 am, at the request of the DPW workers. The dates are as follows, for 2021: April 17, June 19, October 16.

## Planning Board – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that the Planning Board met. She reported that the application for a boundary line adjustment for the Opdyke property on Hewitt Road was adjourned to the December 1 meeting.

## Open Space Committee – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that there was a virtual meeting on October 19. She noted that for the Maresca-Martin project the State has found a possible resolution for access to the cemetery located on that property.

She noted that the is finalizing an easement for the Lee Lau project. She noted that the Curtis farm has received preliminary approval from SADC, which was granted in September for the nonprofit round; final approval is the next step.

Member Katz reported that there are three new properties being reviewed.

Member Katz discussed the Open Space and Improvement Plan being developed by the Recreation Committee. She noted that if this plan is approved by the County, the Township can get up to \$25,000.00 per year for maintenance of Township-owned open space. Member Katz stated that she has been reminding the Committee that the White Oak Trail needs to be included, as does the School Meadow Trail.

## <u>Easement Monitoring</u> – M. Royal

It was noted that the subcommittee working on this is still waiting on Member Dahringer's information. It was noted that the Mummey property, related to the subdivision, does not need to be included due to the preservation of that property, with the farm.

Member Katz noted that additional columns should be added, as follows: one for GPS, one for the County. Secretary Klink, also Administrative Officer for the Planning Board, stated that GPS information is required as part of any subdivision. Said information goes to the County and could easily be copied to the Township.

There was a discussion about environmental easements that should be part of full disclosure at the time of property sales.

## Schools – K. Klink

#### Grants – M. Royal

Member Royal stated that the EC needs to figure out an approach for grant-filings. She stated that as discussed previously, the EC needs to have projects or goals, and then look for a grant to match. It was also decided that there should be a project discussion item on the EC agenda.

## Some ideas, as follows were discussed:

• Renewable energy projects, such as a charging station

There was a discussion about charging stations. It was noted that there are three in Stockton, in the old Colligan Inn parking lot. It was noted that the County lists the locations of charging stations. There was an idea that there be a meter on any station, so that there is only charging at certain times. It was noted that the State only reimburses about \$6,500.00 for such projects.

• Solar energy at Dilts Park

This discussion included the topic of visibility and best location. It was noted that the suggestion was to use the Shack, as it has the best electrical infrastructure. It was also noted that placing it on the Pavilion would provide greater visibility.

#### Website – J. Kafarski

Member Kafarski reported that he has seen nothing new on the website since the last meeting. He noted that at this time the only change that can be made is for the fourth quarter topic.
