

<u>PELAWARE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE</u> <u>REGULAR MEETING MINUTES</u> October 13, 2020 – 7:30 PM

Mayor Charles Herman called the regular meeting of the Delaware Township Committee to order on October 13, 2020 at 7:30 PM. Mayor Herman announced that this meeting is called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was faxed to the Hunterdon County Democrat, Trenton Times, Courier News and the Star Ledger; was posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building and filed with the Township Clerk on January 3, 2020.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Herman led those in attendance in the pledge to the nation's flag.

ROLL CALL

Present: Mayor Charles Herman, Deputy Mayor James Waltman, Committee Members Daniel Kwasnik, Susan Lockwood and Joseph Vocke along with Township Clerk Maria Andrews.

APPROVAL OF TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion by Waltman, seconded by Lockwood to approve the Committee's 9/28/20 regular and executive session meeting minutes with no revisions noted was unanimously approved by voice vote.

TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE REPORTS

Committeeman Kwasnik noted he spoke with DPW Director Jay Trstensky and confirmed the stone and chip road projects are on schedule. The department will also be cleaning the ditches along the sides of the road

Deputy Mayor Waltman noted he spoke with Township Engineer Roseberry regarding the speeding issues raised on Sanford Road. He indicated he will get the speed study report from Chief Cane and make a recommendation.

With regard to the intersection of Route 604 and Zentek Road, Deputy Mayor Waltman stated Chief Cane advised that he cannot pull data specific to that intersection but could provide a report showing how many tickets were issued on Route 604. He also noted that Police were at that location 56 times in the month September.

Committeewoman Lockwood noted that the Open Space Committee had not met and that the Pipeline Committee expects to meet this Thursday in-person with a call-in option. She also remarked that the deadline for the December edition of The Bridge is 10/31/20.

Committeeman Vocke stated he had nothing to update the Committee on.

Mayor Herman noted there will be a pumpkin carving contest at Dilts Park. Pumpkins should be carved at home and dropped off at the pavilion between 9:00~AM-9:30~AM on Saturday 10/31/20. Residents are encouraged to cast their votes between 10:00~AM-12:00~PM with prizes awarded for the following categories: Classic, scariest, funniest, most creative and 2020 theme. Winners will be announced at 12:30~PM.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC (For Items Not on the Agenda)

Mayor Herman opened the floor to public comment for items not on the agenda.

Roger Byrom of 7 Zentek Road spoke up and remarked he wished to follow up on a previous conversation regarding the sidewalk from the school and what he referred to as the "inappropriately built historic stonewall." Mayor Herman explained the entire project, including the wall was approved by the

State Historic Preservation office (SHPO) with oversight by Township Engineer Roseberry. Mayor Herman suggested that if Mr. Byrom took issue with the project he should reach out to SHPO.

Chuck Cline of 139 Upper Creek Road spoke up asking for an update on the ash borer infestation in Dilts Park. Mr. Hornsby spoke up from the public and explained the affected trees in the wood areas and along the property lines have been cut down. He remarked that they are looking into grant money for replanting to help mitigate any potential erosion.

Mr. Byrom of 7 Zentek Road spoke up again regarding resident Bill Flemming speaking to him about the lack of ADA compliant parking at the municipal building. Mayor Herman clarified that Mr. Flemming had asked about ADA compliant parking at the Post Office which he noted is actually on private property.

Seeing no other members of the public come forward, Mayor Herman closed the floor to public comment.

\$150.00 - \$250.00 /monthly

Meeting Coverage

\$225.00/per meeting

(For a Vacant Position or Special Meeting)

Discussion: "March on Litter" Event

Mayor Herman explained this is the 29th year the Township clean-up event has taken place. This year due to COVID the Township cannot utilize the buses from Hunterdon Central so Ms. Klink is proposing to conduct the clean-up by "road" coordinated by "families" who will serve as Road Captains. It was noted that no county roads will be included in the clean-up effort. Mayor Herman thanked Ms. Klink for her creativity and dedication in keeping up with this annual event.

Any interested parties should contact Ms. Klink. Road Captains must sign up by 10/20/20 and participating families must sign up by 10/27/20.

It was noted for the record that the Committee wholeheartedly supported the March on Litter event.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Roger Byrom of 7 Zentek Road spoke up again thanking the Committee for their follow up with Chief Cane regarding the speeding on Township roads and asked if they would support solar powered speed readers. Deputy Mayor Waltman commented that he will speak to Chief Cane and DPW Director Trstensky about this idea.

Chuck Cline of 139 Upper Creek Road spoke up commenting he appreciated copies of the resolutions being made available at this evening's meeting and asked if they could also be posted on the Township website. Clerk Andrews explained she did not believe it is a good policy to do so and noted if anyone asks for copies of anything that is listed on the agendas once they are posted, she will provide the documentation.

FINAL COMMENTS OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Mayor Herman commented that he would like to have a Proclamation for Raymond Vanden Berghe, Sr. to be presented to his family at an upcoming meeting for all of his dedicated service to the community. He also noted he met with the Scouts at Dilts Park and remarked Niece Lumber has been very generous in donating materials for their project. Committeewoman Lockwood asked for details on the project so she can include an article in The Bridge.

Mayor Herman noted the DPW had filled in the potholes on Lower Creek Road but commented they need to find a more permanent solution because the recent heavy rains has washed them out again.

Next, Mayor Herman stated he received a letter from a resident who lives in Rosemont and has regular flights going over his home. Apparently, a local flight school flies this path 270 times per week and since there are no FAA violations, nothing can be done about it. It was the consensus of the Committee to send a letter to the flight school asking them to consider spreading out their training flight patterns.

Lastly, Mayor Herman asked if the Committee wished to implement any guidelines on Halloween/Trick-or-Treating celebrations. It was noted the Committee will approve a resolution at their next meeting establishing a 10 PM curfew on Halloween, 10/31/20, consistent with what has been done in previous years.
