Meet Your Neighbor: John C. Goodwin

Intil recently John Goodwin might have been known to area folks as the walker in the orange vest. Now, he has attained another identity - that as the author of *Skunktown Trail in New Jersey - Remembering Yesterday*, a book with lots of photos and information about the history of Sergeantsville* and surrounding areas.

John, originally from Wilmington, Delaware, came to know the Sergeantsville area when he met and eventually married Eileen Burget. She grew up in Sergeantsville and has roots in the Township that go way back. John settled with Eileen in Sergeantsville in 1974. She is the daughter of Henry and Mary Burget and it was her father Henry who in 1941 opened the doors to what is now the Sergeantsville Grain and Feed.

One evening while listening to his wife and her cousin Alan Brown reminisce over old photos and other memorabilia, John realized there was important history in what they knew and that it would be lost if not recorded. And with that, the idea for a book was born.

John's dedication to walking, two or more hours daily and always wearing an orange vest, stood him in good stead while gathering information for the book. He wanted it to be a history as residents remembered it, using whatever photos and other memorabilia they had. To obtain this information he knocked on many doors, not knowing most of the people therein. While few knew his name many recognized him as the walker in the orange vest and invited him in.

Basketball brought John to New Jersey. He went to Rider College on a basketball scholarship and is listed in Rider's basketball Hall of Fame. He went on to coach at both Rider College and Wagner College in Staten Island.

This was followed by two years in the US Army with a 13-month tour in Vietnam. Upon returning home, John completed a Master's Degree in Education at Southern Illinois University. His career as a salesman, first with the natural gas industry and then with petrochemical-nuclear-fluid power, took him on extensive travels around Canada, the United States, and Mexico.

John likes to write and in addition to this current book has written about sales, fishing, Vietnam, and his experience as a warden in a maximum security prison.

His book provides a fun and interesting tour of the area in and around Sergeantsville and if you have an opportunity to read the book you are sure to discover some surprises as well.

It took John five months to gather information and put the book together and the journey took him down to Stockton, out to Devil's Tea Table, over to Locktown, and up to Ringoes. And if you see a tall man

walking about the area in an orange vest, honk and wave.

* For those who don't know, up until 1827 when
a post office was established in the town, Sergeantsville
was known as Skunktown (origin unknown).

Be Prepared: Plastic Bag Ban Starts May 4

On May 4, 2022, New Jersey's ban on single-use plastic carryout bags goes into effect. The law was enacted to help protect the environment by reducing plastic waste, which pollutes our waterways and releases toxic chemicals into the environment.

The new law prohibits stores from providing or selling single-use plastic bags. This ban applies to most retail establishments including grocery stores, convenience stores, liquor stores, pharmacies, delis, restaurants, vending trucks, movie theaters and others.

Large grocery stores (2,500 sq ft or more in size) are also banned from providing single-use paper bags. These stores may only provide or sell reusable carryout bags that are made of washable fabric, have stitched handles, and are designed and manufactured for multiple reuses.

If you usually rely on single-use bags when you go to the grocery store, start getting in the habit of bringing your own bags when you shop. While many grocery stores sell reusable bags, businesses are not required to provide them. There are no restrictions on the type of bag you can bring with you to go shopping.

Some plastic bags will continue to be allowed under the new law. Examples include bags used for the following: uncooked meat, fish, or poultry; loose items such as fruits, vegetables, nuts, coffee, baked goods, candy, greeting cards, flowers, or small hardware items; live fish or insects sold in a pet store; and food sliced or prepared to order.

Also excluded from the ban are laundry, dry cleaning, and garment bags; bags provided by a pharmacy for prescription drugs; and bags for newspapers. Furthermore, packages of trash bags and lawn bags are not impacted by the ban and are still eligible to be sold in stores.

In addition to the ban of plastic carryout bags, the new law prohibits the sale and use of polystyrene foam food products. This includes food containers, plates, hot or cold beverage cups, meat or vegetable trays, cutlery or egg cartons.

Wondering what to do with that old window air conditioner which no longer works? Well Do conditioner which no longer works? Well, Delaware Township clean-up days are coming from 7:30 -10:30am at the Delaware Twp Garage at 816 Sergeantsville Road (Rt. 523).

How to Participate:

- * 50 permits will be issued for this Clean-Up Day at the Township Police Station, Sergeantsville Road (Route 523), south of Sergeantsville. Call Dee Higgins, 609-397-3530, with questions, about registering.
- * For a fee, permits will be available three weeks before each Clean Up Day. Proof of residency (e.g. driver's license, current tax bill, etc.) must be provided at the time of application, along with a description of the vehicle that will be used; plus your best telephone contact information.
- * Residents may obtain one permit for each Clean-Up Day. A new permit must be obtained for each Clean-Up Day. Contact Kathy Klink, 609-397-3240, ext. 208, if you have questions.
- * This permit must be presented at the Clean-Up Day before you will be allowed to unload your vehicle.
- * Vehicle unloading will be done by the resident AND Township personnel. Items deemed to be unacceptable will be left on vehicles. Residents are requested to separate from bulky waste: Construction and Demolition wood; electronics – separate dumpsters will be available and these are items to be unloaded by residents.

Items Accepted include, but not limited to:

- * Furniture and other household bulky waste
- * Air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators (with or without Freon), and propane tanks
- * All types of metals
- * The acceptance of building materials is limited to one half of a standard pick-up truck load and may not exceed four feet in length.
